## **Traditional Camps**

Traditional camps offer weekly theme-based activities along with fun-filled field trips. Campers will have the opportunity to explore daily outdoor fun, hands-on activities, and tons of summer camp fun!

### **WEEKLY THEMES:**

<u>S.T.E.A.M It Up:</u> Campers will engage in science, technology, engineering, art, and math experiences that will be incorporated into hands-on activities. These hands-on activities will keep campers engaged, intrigued, and foster critical thinking, problem-solving, and the art of creativity.

<u>Sports Mania</u>: Campers will enjoy an action pack, fun-filled week of sports with an emphasis on learning and developing fundamental movement skills they will enjoy. The focus will be on a variety of sports and outdoor games, emphasizing teamwork, and basic skills development for physical activities such as track and field, tennis, basketball and even kickball.

<u>Unique Camping Experiences</u>: Campers will enjoy the idea of camping in a unique way. Campers will transform their summer camp into a haven of creativity with simple, nature-inspired arts and crafts.

<u>Red, White, and Blue Celebration</u>: Why not help build campers excitement of an upcoming holiday by providing them with some fun patriotic arts, crafts, and activities? Red, white, and blue activities will occur throughout the week to show appreciation for the 4<sup>th</sup> of July.

<u>Groove and Move</u>: Campers will learn about different music genres, perform various locomotor movements, and dance sequences while moving to the beat of music. This will increase their heart rates and allow them to learn the importance of aerobic activity and discover ways to keep their bodies healthy and happy.

<u>Around the World in 5 days</u>: Campers will learn about different countries, their traditions, music, food, create passports and get them stamped as they visit the different classes within summer camp. Campers will also engage in creating art projects that relate to each country they research.

<u>Games Galore</u>: This week campers will learn skills on how to create and strategize games they create themselves, or at the least, allow them to change the way they play an already familiar game. Creating games allows the campers to investigate the creation of a game and the justification behind rules. Campers will also learn good sportsmanship, as well as being cooperative and able to work together as a team.

## **2025 SUMMER CAMP INFORMATION**

#### **Full Day**

Operating Hours: 6:45 AM – 6:00 PM (AM & PM snacks provided) Total Cost: \$160.00 per week Weekly Deposit: \$80.00 All summer camps are licensed by the North Carolina Division of Child Development and can receive families with subsidies through Child Care Resources, Inc. (CCRI). Staff to student ratios are 1:19 or 2:25.

- Families are responsible for transportation to and from the camp.
- ASEP Summer Camp is open for current CMS students <u>only</u>. Students who have completed Kindergarten through age 12 are eligible to attend.
- Summer Camp Registrations Begins Monday, March 3, 2025 at 7:00 AM
- Summer Camps are closed Friday, July 4<sup>th</sup>
- Summer feeding sites are Shamrock Gardens, Idlewild and Pineville <u>only</u>. At these sites, campers will receive a hot/cold breakfast, a hot lunch, and a PM snack.

## HOW TO ENROLL:

#### The following requirements are needed in order to complete enrollment in the ASEP Summer Camp:

- 1. Enroll for all weeks, some weeks, or some weeks at one site and some at another. The cost is \$160.00 per week, per student attending ASEP summer camps.
- 2. Deposits are not required of families with CCRI and McKinney Vento (MCV) funding). All payments for summer camp will be processed through the Eleyo payment system. We will **NOT** accept on-site payments with checks or money orders.
  - A \$47 per family registration fee is required only if children are not currently enrolled in the ASEP.
  - An \$80 per week (*non-refundable/non-transferable*) deposit for summer camp will reserve a space for your child. The remaining balance will be due Monday prior to the week your child will be attending summer camps.
  - Upon receipt of a CCRI family contract, the ASEP will obtain a voucher directly from CCRI through the NC Fast system. \*CCRI, McKinney Vento (MCV) and DSS families must complete a summer camp contract no later than June 6, 2025 in order to have vouchers in place for service.
  - Families with CCRI co-payments will be responsible for making weekly fee payments through the Eleyo payment system.
  - No additional activity fees will be charged.
  - Fees are non-refundable/non-transferable.

#### ASEP 2025 Summer Camp Payment Guidelines

ASEP Summer Camps require an \$80 deposit for each week of camp per child registered, due at the time of registration.

The remaining full cost of camp of \$80 per week for each child registered is due the Monday prior to the week of camp your child will be attending Summer Camps. Failure to pay the remaining balance will result in forfeiture of your child's spot for Summer Camp. <u>NO Exceptions</u>.
