Dear Maverick Families:

Welcome to the 2023-2024 School Year! We are excited for another year of learning and growth with our Maverick Students. As your Principal, I remain committed to a safe and orderly environment that allows students to grow, both academically, socially and emotionally. Our school consists of approximately 1,065 students and over 100 staff members. We are diverse and pride ourselves on this. Families are critical to the success of our goals and mission. We cannot do this work without you. I ask for your partnership and involvement as we work to make Francis Bradley Middle School the best school!

Francis Bradley Middle School hours are 9:15 a.m. until 4:15 p.m. The tardy bell rings promptly at 9:15 a.m. Students may not be dropped off prior to 8:45 a.m. as staff members are not on duty and there is no supervision. The only exception is for students who are meeting a staff member for tutoring or a club meeting. Students are expected to be in their homeroom when the tardy bell rings. You can review a copy of our bell schedule here: <https://bit.ly/3Qdv8Nc> Early dismissal will not occur after 3:30 p.m. If you need your child for an appointment, they must be picked up prior to 3:30 p.m. to avoid a disruption to our school day.

To uphold our commitment to safety and security, visitors are limited at Bradley. All visitors must check in at the window outside the main office and if admitted, complete the sign in process at the kiosk. Each student will be assigned a Chromebook and charger that they will take home with them on a daily basis. Distribution will not begin until after the start of school. Parents will be required to complete a technology waiver and there are fees for damaged, lost, or stolen items. We ask for your support in ensuring that your child's Chromebook is charged each day for learning.

It is extremely important that your child carefully read all of the information in this letter with you. Please keep it on file for future reference. Open House

Open House will be held on Thursday, August 24. The Open House schedule on page 2 is divided into two groups based on your child’s grade level or enrollment in the Extensions Program. Please arrive only during your child’s designated time as parking is limited. If you are unable to attend Open House your family can familiarize themselves with Bradley Middle School by visiting our school website. The purpose of Open House is to familiarize yourself with our campus and meet your child’s teachers.

School Lunch and Breakfast

Students are encouraged to eat lunch and breakfast each day. Breakfast is free of charge for all students; however, students need to pay for school lunch. If your family qualifies for free lunch, submit a meal application through the School Nutrition Services department: <https://bit.ly/3OgcYut> Students will only be allowed to eat breakfast and lunch inside of the cafeteria. Parents/guardians are not permitted to bring in outside food, nor eat with their child during lunch due to safety and supervision.

Transportation

Eligible students who are enrolled by July 14 and have registered for transportation services should have a stop for the first day of school, Monday, August 28. Go to the CMS website to complete the form if you need to do so: <https://bit.ly/3QsiAlt> If students are taking yellow school bus transportation, they should arrive at the morning bus stop at least 10 minutes prior to pick up. Bradley has no authority to establish or change stops. I encourage all families to enroll in transportation updates via the *Here Comes the Bus App*. Typically, during the first two weeks of school, buses are delayed. We will communicate afternoon late buses through the Parent Square feature. Our main office is open until 5 p.m. with any questions.

Student Fees

Families are required to purchase an agenda for their child, which is vital to school success and parent communication regarding the Student Code of Conduct, dates and assignments. We also encourage families to purchase an available PE uniform, which supports a Healthy, Active, Child. To purchase these items, visit: <https://bit.ly/BradleyOSPlink> Students are required to wear sneakers, shorts and a t-shirt for PE. Lockers will be available for purchase after the first two weeks of school. We discourage locker rentals as there is not a need; however, this option is available. Each grade level has different locker procedures and policies.

General Information

- ★ The safety and security of your child are my top priority! In order for our school to create and maintain a positive environment where students can learn, behavior infractions that create a disruption and/or unsafe environment will not be tolerated. Visit the CMS website for the most up to date district Code of Conduct, as well as vital parent information. I strongly encourage each family to review the CMS Code of Conduct, the Bradley policies and procedures in the Student Handbook, as well as the detailed orientation that students will receive from administrative staff during the first two weeks of school, so that we all ensure there is a safe and orderly environment on campus.
 - A school dress code, in alignment with CMS district policy, has been established to maintain a focused learning environment.
 - Clothing or jewelry with abusive, suggestive, or profane language, symbols of illegal drugs or weapons, or any other words, symbols, or slogans that disrupt the learning environment are not permitted.
 - Headgear is not permitted to be worn in the building. Headgear includes: Hoods, scarves, bandannas, stocking caps, hats, towels, sunglasses, doo-rags, combs, or other items worn on the head that are not related to religious observance. *Note:* garments with a hood *may* be worn. The *hood* must remain *down* while on campus.
 - Undergarments, including bras, underwear, boxer shorts, etc., should not be visible.
 - Upper torsos and midribs must be covered at all times.
 - Shorts, skirts, dresses, or clothing with slits must comply with #3 and #4. These items must be at least thumb length when arms extended at the side.
 - Halter tops, tops secured by strings, elastic straps or strapless shirts are not permitted. Tank tops must be at least two finger widths wide and comply with #3 and #4. Athletic jerseys need to have a shirt underneath.
 - When wearing close-fitting bottoms, tops must appropriately cover the private areas.
 - Pajamas or pajama-like clothing and bedroom slippers are not permitted, except for designated events.
 - School dress code applies to special events and after school functions, unless noted otherwise.
 - District and School Cell Phone Policy:
 - If a student is bringing a personal cell phone/smartwatch or other personal electronic device, it is required that the device remain off and stored securely in the student's backpack during the entire school day. This includes lunch and outside time. A structured learning environment, free of distractions, is critical to our success and for those reasons, we allow no use of cell phones, apple watches or other personal electronic devices.
 - Students found in violation of the policy will have the device confiscated and a parent will be required to pick up the device. Discipline will fall in alignment with the CMS Student Code of Conduct.
 - If you need to deliver a message to your child, please call the school line directly: (980)-343-5750.
 - The district is not responsible for theft, loss, or damage to cell phones or other personal devices brought onto CMS property. Students must follow all rules set forth in Policy S-SINT and Regulation S-SINT/R.
 - EVOLV Body Scanners: CMS has implemented body scanners at all K-8, 6-8 and 9-12 schools that students will enter each morning before school. We utilize two scanners at the front entrance to the school - one for bus riders and one for car riders. Students will remove laptops, metal water bottles and any umbrellas prior to entering and pass through the scanners as they would normally travel. In the event an item sets off the scanners, students will be asked to step aside for school personnel to check. We also utilize the body scanners for any visitors entering our campus during the school day. I care deeply about your child's well-being and we all own a safe and orderly environment. - ★ Student Drop Off through personal transportation does not begin before 8:45 a.m. No staff are on duty prior to this time. The last time for early release is 3:30 p.m. Please plan accordingly. Dismissal will begin at 4:10 p.m. and students will be called in stages for dismissal. We ask that parents be patient during the first few weeks of school as we work through transportation challenges. Adhere to all car line staff in a respectful manner. Your child and my staff's safety are my priority!
