ELA & Math/Mateen

- 6th Math: Math 6 S- unit 5: arithmetic in base 10. Unit covers all decimal operations:+, -, x, and divide. Starting dividing this week and will finish by end of Jan.
- 6th Math H: just completed mid-unit assessment for unit 3- covering ratios, unit rates and percentages. Focusing on rates right now and will be covering redpercentages soon. End of unit should happen around feb 9th.
- 7th Math: started unit 5: rational numbers arithmetic. In this unit, students will
 extend their previous understanding of addition and subtraction using the
 properties of operations and real-world contexts to perform operations w/pos and
 neg numbers.
- 7th Math H: students just recently completed a 2-day slope WS that was deemed necessary in addressing misconceptions from an earlier unit. Now, we're in unit 4- linear equations. Review and an end unit assessment will happen this week. Then, we'll start unit 5- expressions and equations. This is a heavy assessment time w/end units, q2 benchmarks, and winter MAP.
- 8th Math: Tomorrow we will be on Unit 5 Lesson 3 students will be finding outputs from equations and learning independent and dependent variables
- Math 1: Math 1 students finished Unit 4: Two-Variable Statistics last Thursday. We are taking the Midterm in class today, and will begin Unit 5:Functions by the end of the week! I apologize for my delayed response.
- Math 2: just finished unit 3 properties of exponents and radicals with different roots. We started parallel lines cut with a transversal and exploration of the angles this creates. Triangle proofs with SSS, SAS, AAS are set for this week as well as exterior angle theorem.
- 6th ELA: unit 2, Boy who Harnessed the Wind. Students are investigating the cyclical nature of design thinking and the way the author develops this idea using specific details. The 2nd half of the unit, students will finish reading and launch their research project. Inspired by a curated list of TED talks, students choose a different invention designed to solve a critical problem. Workbook pages will be coming home for HW soon also.
- 7th ELA: unit 3 of module 2. Students are wrapping up their podcast scripts (narrative nonfiction) on an epidemic they've researched.
- 8th ELA: wrapping up module 2, unit 3 (infographic for an argumentative essay including skills like identifying claims, counterclaims, and writing a rebuttal. This will be wrapped up by next Monday. Then, we'll begin mod 3 on the Holocaust.
- 8th ELA Honors: just begun module 3. Looking at historical aspects of the Holocaust to familiarize oneself with it before beginning the anchor text- Maus, a graphic novel.
