Lead Update:

MTSS Update/Curns

 Reviewed Winter MAP data in one-on-one meetings with all Math and ELA teachers; working on developing plans with teachers in order to help with continued MAP growth in preparation for Spring MAP and EOGs coming up.

Science/McCain

- 6th grade: Students are starting the Rock Cycle unit and discussing weathering and erosion.
- 7th grade: Students are learning about Cell Division and Mitosis.
- 8th grade: Students are working on the ecosystem and factors that affect the ecosystem.

Social Studies/Cafero

- 6th grade: Students are learning about the Middle Ages; they just finished a Socratic seminar on Ancient Greece and Rome.
- 7th grade: Students just finished a World War One unit. Their next unit is the Rise of the Dictators.
- 8th grade: Just finished WW1 unit.

ELA & Math/Mateen

- 6th ELA: Students have Mid-Unit Assessments going on; Teachers would like to finish Module 3 Unit 2 before Spring Break. In order to prepare for the end of the year, teachers are doing EOG style reviews as Warm Ups.
- 7th ELA: Students are finishing Module 3 Unit 3 and writing an essay around common themes in the Harlem Renaissance.
- 8th ELA: Students are wrapping up their Holocaust Unit in Module 3. In doing so, they are working on Graphic Panels around the idea of being an Upstander.
- 6th Math: Students are working on integers and the context of positive and negative numbers in relation to zero on a number line.
- 6th Honors Math: Students are currently in Unit 6, which is Rational Numbers.
 They will finish this unit before spring break and have one unit left before EOG review.
- 7th Math: Students are exploring an Angles unit; this unit will carry over after Spring Break. They will also be taking a Benchmark on the 23 and 24 of March.

- 7th Honors Math: Students are learning about the relationships in three dimensional shapes. They will conclude Unit 6 soon and have a benchmark on the 23 and 24 of March as well.
- 8th Math: Students finished Unit 6 this week. They are starting Unit 7 and hoping
 to finish before spring break so they can complete Unit 8 and then complete
 reviews in preparation for the EOGs.
- Math I: Students started Unit 7; this is their largest Unit (with 26 lessons) so students will be working on this for a while.
