Lead Updates:

Technology/Dewalt- 30 students without a computer. 35 computers at the repair warehouse. 8-10 computers in transit back to the school.

Athletics/Goodrum- Athletics is in its last season of the year. Home games listed in the announcements. Once the season ends we will begin to wind things down and do inventory in preparation for next fall.

MTSS Update/Curns- Teachers are utilizing supplemental resources in class (including iReady, DreamBox, and Kahn academy) to help reloop standards before the final round of Benchmark testing and MAP testing.

Science/Anderson- 8th Grade Science- 8th grade just finished the unit on ecosystems. Currently, they are reviewing and will take the Benchmark assessment next Wednesday. After it is completed they will begin the next unit on Energy.

7th grade Science- 7th grade on their Genetics unit. Currently, they are discussing selective breeding and pedigrees. They will finish the unit next week and move into the Force, Motion, and Energy unit next quarter.

6th Grade Science- 6th grade just finished the unit on Rocks and Soil. We just began the unit on Plants. We are identifying and discussing the parts/functions of the flower. We will continue this unit with photosynthesis, tropism, and cellular respiration.

Social Studies/Cafero-

6th grade-Students have been finishing up Unit 4 and are starting UNIT 5 on Japan and the Middle Ages.

7th grade- Students are finishing up Unit 6, WWI and WWII. They are looking at the impact of WWII; for example, looking at the atomic bomb.

8th grade-8th grade is currently working on the Great Depression. With this, students are especially focusing on Reading Comprehension through a higher level passage titled "Life During the Great Depression: Hoovervilles".

ELA/Mateen- General info: last benchmark this Monday. Each grade level has used the last benchmark to review for upcoming one in different ways. 6th grade: text- Two Roads, Module 3 took M3 Mid-unit 2 assessment yesterday. Working on POV, pronoun case, and writing effective summaries.

7th grade- finishing up Module 3. Until break, PLC will focus on relooping standards students struggled with. Some of the topics are POV, story elements like characterization, theme/main idea, and delineating an argument.

8th grade: text- Maus, module 3

Finishing up the module. Currently working on a creative writing assignment where they create the character profile of an upstander from the Holocaust, and create a fictional character interview.

Math/Johnson-Ritchey- Students have been working on reviewing standards from the second round of Benchmark testing in order to prepare for the final round of benchmark testing next week. The units that each grade level are working on currently will be completed before spring break. After spring break, classes will finish up their last unit and then begin preparing for EOG review.
