## CenterPoint Information Provided by CMS

CenterPoint's interim assessments **are designed to show students' progress toward meeting End of Year expectations**. Each assessment is intentionally designed to balance the assessment of each evidence statement throughout the school year. These assessments are **intentionally designed to be rigorous. To this end, when reviewing student data, you may see significant gaps in demonstration of mastery at the Beginning and Middle of the Year."**

It would therefore not be appropriate to match CenterPoint's mastery levels to the district's MasteryConnect levels as it will give a false sense of students' performance. For example, students scoring 51-70% are showing mastery on our assessment. If we adjusted mastery levels for our assessment to match CMS classroom assessment performance levels, we would forecast that most students would falsely show as near mastery or needing remediation. This is because the percentage cut scores cannot be applied equivalently as rigor of the assessment measures are not equivalent.
