Celebrations

- We celebrated the 100th day of school on Feb. 12th.
- On Wednesday, we celebrated the A/B Honor Roll in grades 3-5. In grades K-2 we acknowledged Most Improved in ELA/Math and Citizenship Awards. Across all grade levels we celebrated perfect attendance.
- Mrs. Barringer was announced as the Teacher Assistant of the Year
- Twenty-one 4th and 5th grade students were selected to the safety patrol including three appointed captains during 2nd quarter.
- Forty-six of our seventy-four 5th grade students were accepted

into magnet middle schools during the school choice options lottery.

- The buzz bucks behavioral incentive program made great progress during the 2nd quarter. Students' enthusiasm increased and overall participation and buy in increased as well.
- The National Junior Beta kicked off its clothing drive community service project at the end of the 2nd quarter. This project will be ongoing through the 4th quarter.
- Chronic absenteeism has decreased by 3% in the last two weeks, and we are quickly approaching our SIT goal of a 30% decrease in chronic absences for the year, we are at 31% decrease so far.
- 50 students received blankets and socks during a holiday giveaway through our partnership with Hopewell High School and the Chick-fila Leadership Program



Grade Level updates

Pre-K

Pre-K had a successful fashion show to end our Clothing unit.

We completed our second round of assessments of Letter ID and Sound and PAST.

Students have been preparing for the 100th day of school. families will be invited to a presentation.

We are currently working on our Wheels Unit which is a new addition to our curriculum.

Kindergarten

- We are working on letter/sound relationships, reading strategies, and sight words in literacy.
- In our phonics unit, we have learned our letters and have moved on to using that knowledge to sound out basic CVC words to read short passage.
- In our literacy unit, we recently finished up our study of Weather. Students closed out the unit by writing their own weather story.
- We are now beginning our unit study on Trees and will learn how how trees affect people and animals.
- In math, we have finished learning the numbers 0 through 10 and how to compare them. The students have also learned about 2D and 3D shapes.
- We are now beginning to learn about addition and subtraction up to 10.

We recently celebrated 100 Days of School with our students by popping 100 balloons! The kids had a wonderful time!

1st Grade

- 1st grade students started Module 3 and we have been learning about the birds and how they use their body parts to survive. 1st grade students will use their current and prior knowledge and observations to write high quality stories.
- 1st graders will start our upcoming Unit 3 students will study how specific birds use their body parts to survive. They will break off into their expert bird groups and compose a riddle.
- Skills Small groups have been focused on Encoding, Decoding, Writing, Word Work, Independent Reading catered to the specific literacy skill and assigned Microphase. Students are learning many new rules based on the skills block.
- Writing has become extremely important to the children, They are beginning to write bird riddles, stories, poems, and notes back and forth to each other.
- In math students are sorting through data. We have created bar graphs, pictographs and graphs using tally marks with a heading and categories.

2nd Grade

-In literacy, students have continued to work with informational texts to learn about plants and pollinators. Students have been learning about nonfiction text features.

-Students have been working on writing opinion pieces using supporting details.

-In skills block, we have been learning about the consonant-le syllable type. We have also been working on the ending sounds -k,-ck, and -ic in words.

-In math, students have finished learning how to tell time and count money. We have started our numbers to 1,000 unit working with place value.

3rd Grade

In Literacy, students <u>llearned</u> how to write an informational essay about a frog they have researched. At the end of Module 2, they organized all of their writing from the module and created a book to share their expertise with other students in either 2nd or 3rd grade. The Freaky Frog books included creating a narrative, several short informational pieces, a 3-paragraph informational writing, and a trading card.

In Math, students learned about bar graphs and picture graphs. We worked on using the data from the graphs to answer word problems. The students learned how to find the hidden question in a 2 step problem.

In Social Studies, we learned about how major landmarks in Charlotte got their names.

4th Grade

Revolutionary War, Loyalists vs. Patriots

5th Grade

Case study on Jackie Robinson, How he was viewed as the only black athlete in this sport. Social subjects that cross. Learning about how he broke through social barriers.
