# 5. School Improvement Plan Goals

- a. The percent of Black and Hispanic 3rd grade students combined who score at the College and Career Ready (CCR) level --a 4 or 5-- on the English Language Arts (ELA) EOG will increase from 20.7% in SY 2021-2022 to 35.4% in SY 2022-2023 and 50% in SY 2023-2024. (Aligns with A2.04, B3.03, and CMS Goal 1).
  - i. We have begun to look at data. 86.5% of our school is Black and Hispanic.
  - ii. Have created intervention groups for all grade levels
  - iii. Progress monitoring is occurring weekly
  - iv. Schoolwide reading challenge
- b. We will meet or exceed expected Educator Value Added Assessment System (EVAAS) growth for our overall school index in SY 2022-2023 and SY 2023-2024. (Aligns to A4.01, B3.03, and CMS Goal4).
  - i. We are waiting for the data and will be reflecting on data and then leverage the assets.
- c. The percent of students reporting a positive self-perception of their self-management on the Fall Panorama Screener will increase from 72%

in Grades 3-5 to 75% in Grades 3-5 in September 2024. (Aligns to A4.06 and CMS Guardrail)

- i. Panorama Assessment will occur on October 14th for 3-5th
- d. Duty Free Instructional Planning Time for Teachers: The NC SBE's statutory provision 115C-105.27(b)(7) requires all schools to have a plan to provide virtually, in person, or hybrid duty-free instructional planning time for every teacher under G.S. 115C-301.1, with the goal of providing an average of at least five hours of planning time per week (A2.04).
  - i. Teachers are being provided the state required amount of time for planning.
- e. Bullying Prevention: Provide a positive school climate, under CMS regulations JICK-R, by promoting a safe learning environment free of bullying and harassing behaviors (A4.06).
