#### **Mid-Year Graduation Information**

Mid-Year Graduation will take place on **Thursday, February 8, 2024**, at Bojangles Coliseum located at 2700 E. Independence Blvd in Charlotte **at 4:00pm**.

Graduates need to arrive at 2:45 and enter the BoPlex walkway between the 2 venues. Doors will open to the public for seating at 3:00pm and tickets are not needed to attend. There is no limit on guests for each graduate. Bojangles Coliseum has a clear bag policy with a size limit. Please see the attachment for exact dimensions.

#### Please also note the expectations listed below from Charlotte Mecklenburg Schools:

- Seniors are required to wear appropriate caps and gowns to participate in the graduation ceremony. All seniors, when robed in their caps and gowns, should adhere to the following attire guidelines:
  - Graduates should wear dark dress slacks & a dress shirt and tie or a dark dress/skirt & top and dark dress shoes
  - All caps are to be worn with the tassel to the right until the seniors are declared graduates.
  - No decorations or wording should be added to the cap or gown.
- The following items are not to be worn or carried by graduates:
  - ◊ sunglasses
  - headphones, IPODS, Blue Tooth earpieces
  - head scarves (except for religious purposes)
  - cell phones, cameras, purses
- Appropriate behavior is expected from graduates during the Processional, Ceremony, and Recessional. Graduates who toss their caps at the conclusion of the ceremony will not be allowed to come back in the arena to retrieve their caps.

January 25, 2024

#### January 29- February 2, 2024

Course registration begins for all 9th-11th grade students. Students will receive a registration card and other resources to help them select their classes during homeroom.

#### February 2, 2024

All registration cards must be turned in to homeroom teachers by February 2, 2024.

#### February 5-6, 2026

Students who do not complete a registration card will be called out of class to complete registration cards in the Career Center.

#### February 7, 2024- One day ONLY

Homeroom teachers will pass out registration cards to students. Students will enter classes in Power School. If a student is going to be absent on this day, they will be able to access Power School from home and enter classes.

#### Butler High School Earns AP Computer Science A Female Diversity Award Recognized for Improving Gender Representation in AP Computer Science A

Butler High School has earned the College Board AP<sup>®</sup> Computer Science Female Diversity Award for achieving high female representation in AP Computer Science A. Schools honored with the AP Computer Science Female Diversity Award have expanded girls' access in AP computer science courses.

More than 1,100 institutions achieved either 50% or higher female representation in one of the two AP computer science courses or a percentage of the female computer science exam takers meeting or exceeding that of the school's female population during the 2022-23 school year. In 2023, Butler was one of 225 recognized in the category of AP Computer Science A.

"We're thrilled to congratulate our female AP computer science students and their teachers on this step toward gender parity in computer science education," said Laura Prince. "We're honored that our school earned this distinction and look forward to seeing these young women and others pursue and achieve success in computer science education and careers."

"Computer science is the source code of our economy and much of the career landscape," said Trevor Packer, Head of the AP Program. "In the six years since we began the AP Computer Science Female Diversity Award, it's been heartening to see schools like Butler welcome so many more young women into this vital field."

AP Computer Science A (CSA) students learn to design and implement computer programs that solve problems relevant to today's society. AP Computer Science A, which first debuted in 1988, continues to grow and female participation has increased 69% since 2017, to 24,147 women. Overall AP computer science course participation has increased 147% since 2017, broadening STEM career opportunities for more students.

Providing female students with access to computer science courses is critical to ensuring gender parity in the industry's high-paying jobs and to drive innovation, creativity, and representation. The median annual wage for computer and information technology occupations was \$100,530 in May 2021. However, women represent just 24% of the five million people in computing occupations.

According to a Google study, 54% of female computer science majors took AP CSA in high school. College Board research about AP CSP also finds AP CSP students are nearly twice as likely to enroll in AP CSA, and that for most students, AP CSP serves as a stepping stone to other advanced AP STEM coursework.


These findings highlight the importance of schools nationwide achieving gender parity in AP computer science classrooms. Female students remain underrepresented in our high school computer science classes, accounting for just 34% of AP Computer Science Principles participants and 26% of AP Computer Science A participants. Currently, 57.5% of high schools teach foundational computer science. The 1,127 schools that receive this year's AP Computer Science Female Diversity Award serve as inspirations and models for all U.S. high schools.
