#### Why are we here?

The Elementary and Secondary Education Act (ESEA), as amended by the Every Student Succeeds Act (ESSA) of 2015, requires that each Title I School hold an Annual Meeting for parents/families/community members for the purpose of:

- Informing you of your school's participation in Title I services
- Explaining the requirements of Title I, Part A
- Explaining your rights as parents to be engaged

#### What is a Title I school?

Title I is the largest federally funded educational program. A Title I school is a school receiving federal funds for students. The basic principle of Title I is that schools with large concentrations of low-income students receive supplemental funds to meet students' educational goals.

### What does it mean to be a Title I School?

- Being a Title I school means receiving federal funding (Title I dollars) to <u>supplement</u> the school's existing programs.
   These dollars are used for the following:
  - Identifying students experiencing academic difficulties and providing timely assistance to help students meet the state's challenging content standards.
  - Purchasing supplemental staff/programs/materials/supplies
  - Conducting parent and family engagement meetings/trainings/activities
  - Recruiting/Hiring/Retaining Highly-Qualified Teachers
- Being a Title I school also means encouraging ongoing parent and family engagement and advocating for parents' rights

### How Title I funds are used at GVSA

- Additional Supplies and Resources for students and staff
- Additional Staff Positions
- Parent and Family Engagement Events
- Professional Development for Staff
- Extended Learning Opportunities for Students

#### Parent and Family Engagement Allocation

- Any LEA (school system) with a Title I Allocation exceeding \$500,000 is required by law to set aside 1% of the Title I allocation for parent and family engagement
- Of that 1%, 5% may be reserved at the LEA level for system-wide initiatives related to parental involvement. The remaining 95% must be allocated to all Title I schools in the LEA. Each Title I school receives its portion of the 95% remaining Parent and Family Engagement money to implement school-level parental involvement strategies and activities
- Title I parents have the right to aid in making decisions regarding how parent and family engagement money is spent

### What is the CMS Parent and Family Engagement Policy?

- This policy addresses how the district or LEA will implement the parent and family engagement requirements of the *Every* Student Succeeds Act (ESSA).
  - o It includes the following:
    - The district's expectations for parents
    - How CMS will engage parents in decision-making
    - How the district will work to build the schools' and parents' capacities in the implementation of effective parent and family engagement activities to improve student academic achievement
- Parents and families in Title I schools have the right to be engaged in the review/evaluation of this annual policy

### What is included in GVSA's Parent and Family Engagement Policy?

- This policy addresses how the school will implement the parent and family engagement requirements of the Every Student Succeeds Act (ESSA).
  - Components include the following:
    - How parents can be engaged in decision-making and activities
    - How parent and family engagement funds are being used
    - How information and training will be provided to parents
    - How the school will build capacity in parents and staff for strong parent and family engagement
- Parents of students at Title I schools have the right to be engaged in the development of the school's Parent and Family Engagement Policy

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#### What is the Learning Compact?

 The compact is a commitment from the school, the parent/family, and the student, to share in the responsibility for improved academic achievement

  - A Comprehensive Needs Assessment
  - Goals and Strategies to Address Academic Needs of Students
  - Professional Development Needs
  - Coordination of Resources and Comprehensive Budget
  - The School's Parent and Family Engagement Goals

### How can I volunteer to assist my student with school needs?

- Join or attend the School Improvement Team Meetings
- Volunteer to contact other parents/families regarding important school information, for example:
  - Events occurring at the school
  - Opportunities to participate in or support school activities
  - Learning opportunities for students or families
- On site volunteer opportunities remain limited but remote volunteer opportunities are available. If you are interested in completing volunteer work from home, please contact the school.

### How will I be notified if my child is taught by a teacher who is not Highly-Qualified?

- Being Highly Qualified in NC means you have successfully passed the licensure exams required or received alternate licensure in a way set out by NC law.
- Parents and families are notified if teachers do not meet ESSA's requirements for Highly-Qualified.
- Title I parents and families have the right to request the qualifications of their child's teachers.
  - Parents may request information on teacher qualifications in writing within 30 days.
