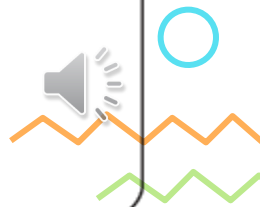

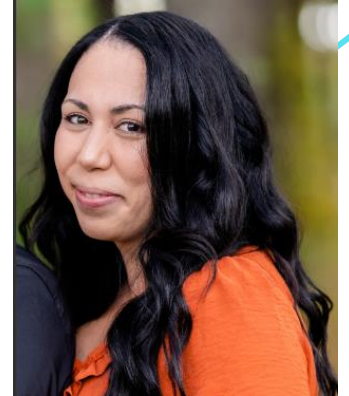

# School Safety



- All visitors must use the front entrance by the main office and be buzzed in.
- All school visitors must sign-in via Lobby Guard in the main office.
  - Includes volunteering, school events, conference with teacher, etc.
  - Expedite sign-in process by registering to be a CMS Volunteer
    - Field Trip chaperones must also be registered CMS volunteers
- Doors remained locked (interior and exterior doors)
- Cameras are monitored (interior and exterior)
- Students and staff wear ID badges
- Safety Drills
  - Fire Drill (required monthly)
  - Lockdown Drill



# Long Creek Elementary Mighty Mustangs!

Long Creek Elementary School is a community and creative arts magnet school located in northern Mecklenburg County. It has a rich history that dates back to 1923. When the school was built in 1923, it housed first through eleventh grades and became an elementary school during the 1950's. The school then grew to five older buildings as well as our new state-of-the-art facility which opened in August 2009.

Currently, Long Creek has approximately 520 students enrolled in kindergarten through fifth grade. There are 29 classroom teachers and several support staff members (Encore, English Learner, Exceptional Children, and Talent Development Teachers as well as Instructional Assistants. In 2018 Long Creek became a Creative Arts Magnet school in partnership with A+ Schools. As a Creative Arts Magnet, students are exposed to the arts in their Encore classes and classroom teachers use the arts to teach core curriculum.





# Our Academic Areas



## Literacy

### EL Curriculum:

The program involves a **module** lesson to establish reading comprehension, **skills block** to practice foundational skills and **labs** to provide time to explore content knowledge.



## Science

We learn basic science skills; how to handle living things; use science equipment; conduct experiments and observe the weather daily.

## Math

### Pearson EnVision Math:

The math curriculum combines problem-based learning and visual learning to deepen students' conceptual understanding.



## Social Studies

We will learn to participate in a group setting; our role in society; cultures; geography and economics.



# Long Creek Elementary: Creative Arts Magnet

- Every student will have the opportunity to participate in Theater, Band, Dance, Music, Media, Art and PE.
- This occurs during their Encore time in the school day.
- Arts elements are also included to enhance the overall standards to meet curriculum goals within literacy, math, science and social studies.





# Kindergarten Registration

## Documents Needed to Enroll:

- o **Birth Certificate** (no hospital, souvenir or Mother copies)
- o Two **Proofs of Mecklenburg County Residency**
- o Current **Immunization Records**  
(Complete record required by 1st day of school entry)
- o **Health Assessment**  
(Required for new kindergarten students by 1st day of school entry)



## Age Requirements:

In compliance with North Carolina law students must be 5 years of age on or before August 31st to be considered for Kindergarten.



# Immunizations and Health Assessment Requirements

- In compliance with North Carolina law, all students entering kindergarten must present a health assessment (physical exam report) by the first day of school entry.
- The assessment must have been completed within 12 months of school entry.
- In addition, North Carolina law requires parents/guardian to present certification of immunizations on the first day of school entry.
- If documentation is not presented, parents and/or guardians have 30 calendar days to provide documentation or the student shall be excluded from school until proof is provided.





# Medication



If medications are needed at school:

- A medication authorization form must be filled out by the doctor and parent. This requirement includes all over-the-counter medications such as Tylenol, cough syrups, and ointments.
- The parent is to provide medications and refills. All medications must be in their **original containers**.
- If your child requires medications or procedures at school, please notify the school nurse or staff now so planning can begin.

**Examples:** Diabetes, Asthma, Severe Allergies, Seizures, or Dietary restrictions.





# Bus Transportation





- Bus transportation is provided for all registered students.
- Bus stops are assigned by the transportation department.
- You will notified of your child's bus stop when you receive the back-to-school packet in early August.
- Kindergarten students are closely monitored as they transition to and from the bus lot.





# Carpool



- The morning carpool line begins at 7:30 a.m.
  - Staff members monitor the carpool line.
  - Students are dismissed at 3:00 p.m. for afternoon carpool.
  - Each family that utilizes personal transportation in the afternoon receives a carpool name display. In early August you will receive more information to help us prepare for dismissal.

# Kindergarten: Early Learning Inventory

- During the first week of school, your child will participate in whole group activities as well as take a brief skills assessment.
- During this time your child will have a one-on-one session to get to know the teacher and complete a brief assessment.
- The assessment results will help us to serve your child's individual needs throughout the school year.

Each student will complete a brief assessment:

- Writing Skills: Writing their Name
- Letter and Sound Recognition
- Counting Skills: Rote counting and counting objects
- Shape and Color Identification
- Sight Word Recognition



# Kindergarten Staggered Entry

Staggered Entry helps kindergarten students get acclimated to their new school in a small group. Each child will be assigned ONE of the following days: August 26<sup>th</sup>; August 27<sup>th</sup>; or August 28<sup>th</sup>. All kindergarten students attend August 30<sup>th</sup>.



## Your Child's Teacher

During Staggered Entry your child will participate in many activities as well as assessments with one of the kindergarten teachers. On Thursday, August 29<sup>th</sup> your child's teacher will notify you of their class placement for the school year.

# What can you do to help your child get ready for kindergarten?



These basic skills can help children move easily into kindergarten. Please practice these skills with your child.

- **Print Motivation:** Read books of interest to your child
- **Vocabulary:** Know the names of things
- **Narrative Skills:** Describe objects and events; tell stories
- **Print Awareness:** Hold a book correctly, follow words on a page
- **Writing Skills:** Grasp a pencil; write name and familiar words
- **Letter Knowledge:** Know letter names and sounds
- **Math Skills:** Practice rote counting; count objects
- **Social /Emotional Skills:** Sharing; listening to others
- **Routine:** Practice a routine or schedule



# Preparing For Kindergarten

## Social

- Opportunities for social interaction with same age peers
- Practice taking turns
- Build social independence
- Follow Multi-Step Directions
- Cleaning up
- Being respectful to others

## Emotional

- Opportunities to problem solve
- Build a love of learning and confidence in approaching new tasks
- Perseverance with tasks
- Working through our emotions in an age-appropriate manner
