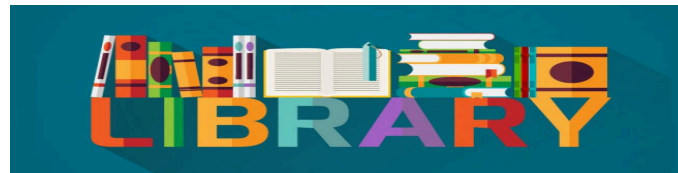

A Look at Library Lessons



Kindergarten - Fifth Grade

Students spent their first week learning about the rules and procedures of the library. Students were able to model for their peers how tasks are to be completed during library class. Students practiced procedures on how to move and communicate in the library.

Kindergarten-Second

Through reading children's books, "Library Books are not for Eating," students learned how to take care of their books. Students learned to treat their books kindly by hugging them, turning pages carefully, not drinking and eating around them, etc. Through reading children's books, students were

able to imagine how characters such as dragons and large dinosaurs are not fit for the library because they are too big in size and they misbehave.

Third Grade

Through interactive videos, students learned that a book is composed of many parts. (Ex: spine, pages, title page, front cover, back author, title, author, and illustrator.) They also demonstrated their understanding by creating a book, and labeling sections of the book.

Fourth and Fifth Grade

Students learned the different parts of the library and the purpose of each. They also drew a map of our library to demonstrate their understanding of the library space.

Google Extension Corner



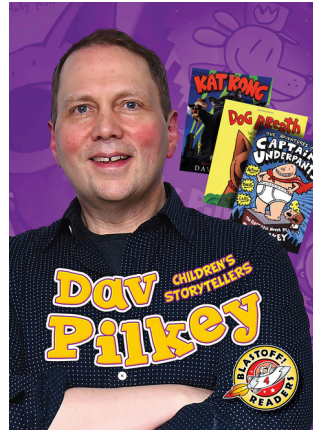
Dualless

Google extensions are small programs that teachers can download to their laptop browsers to add more features and abilities to their teaching bank. They are a great way to enhance students' learning experience, and also give teachers quick tools and features at their fingertips.

If you do not have two desktops, consider Dualless. This extension allows users to split their screen into two. Once your screens are split, users can adjust the sizes of each screen. Dualless allows teachers to display both screens instead of having toggle back and forth between screens.

Dog Man Series by : Dav Pilkey

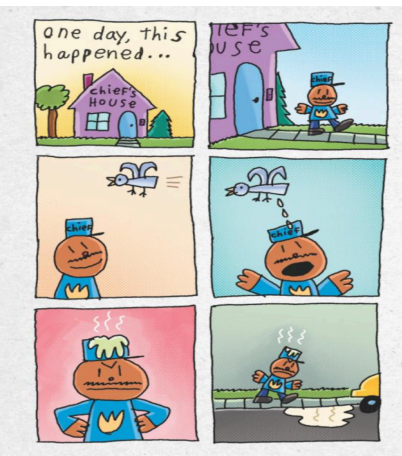


Is your reader a fan of Dog Man? Read below for Fun Facts about the author!
