
INTERNET TRAFFIC LIGHT









What is a GREEN website or app?







What are some "green" websites or apps you visit? How do you know they're safe and just right for you?




What is a YELLOW website or app?

- 4. A site that has you fill out a form.













What is a RED website or app?





To go the right way.


