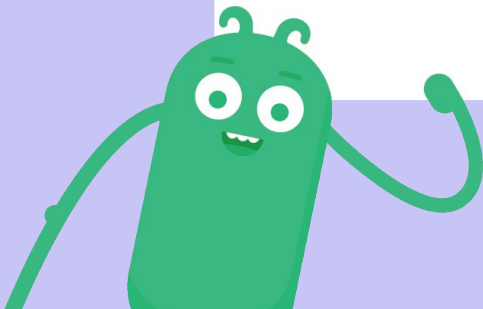

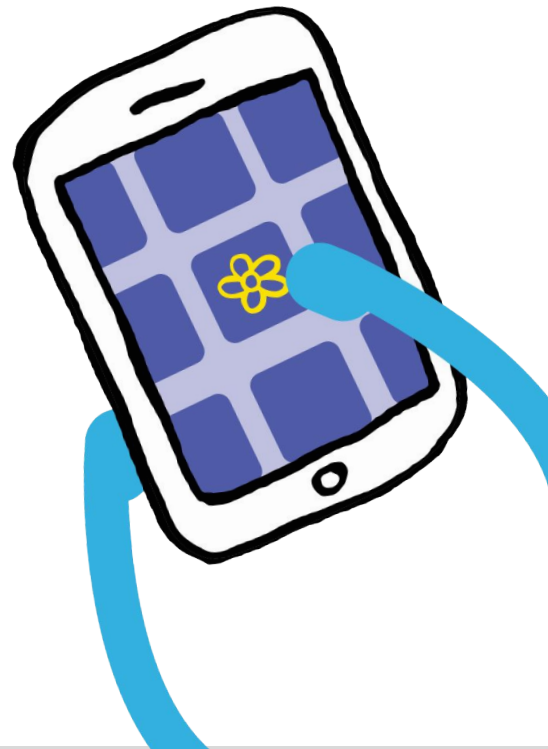

# Device

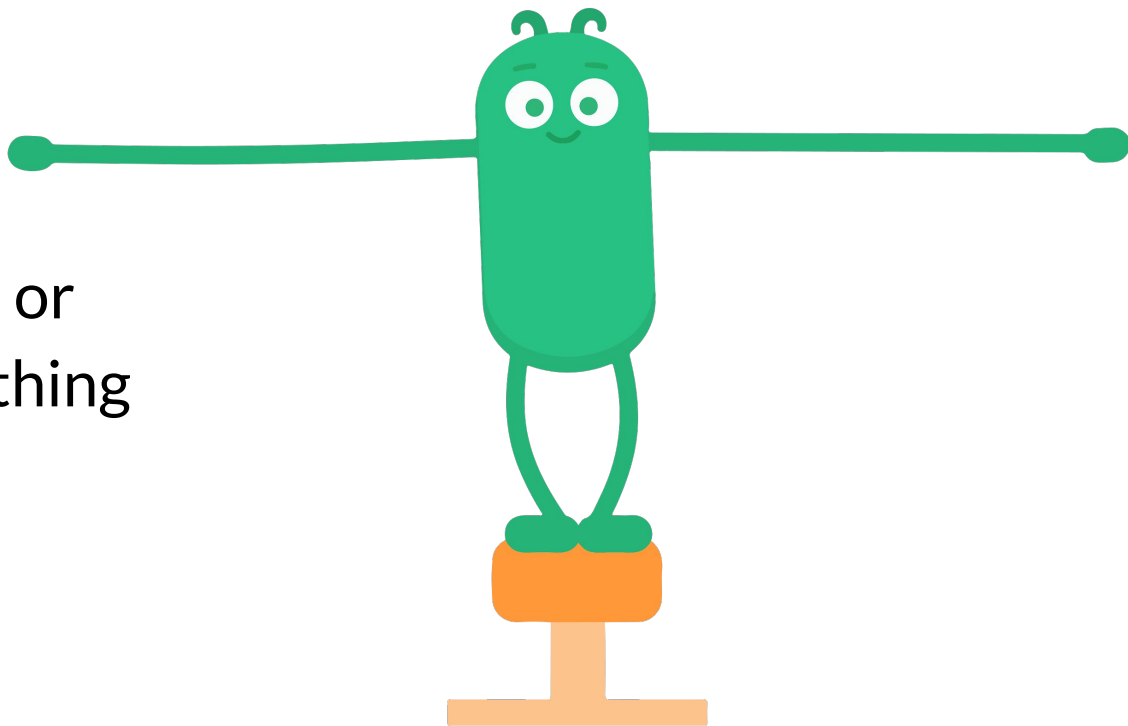
An electronic piece of equipment like a phone, tablet, or laptop

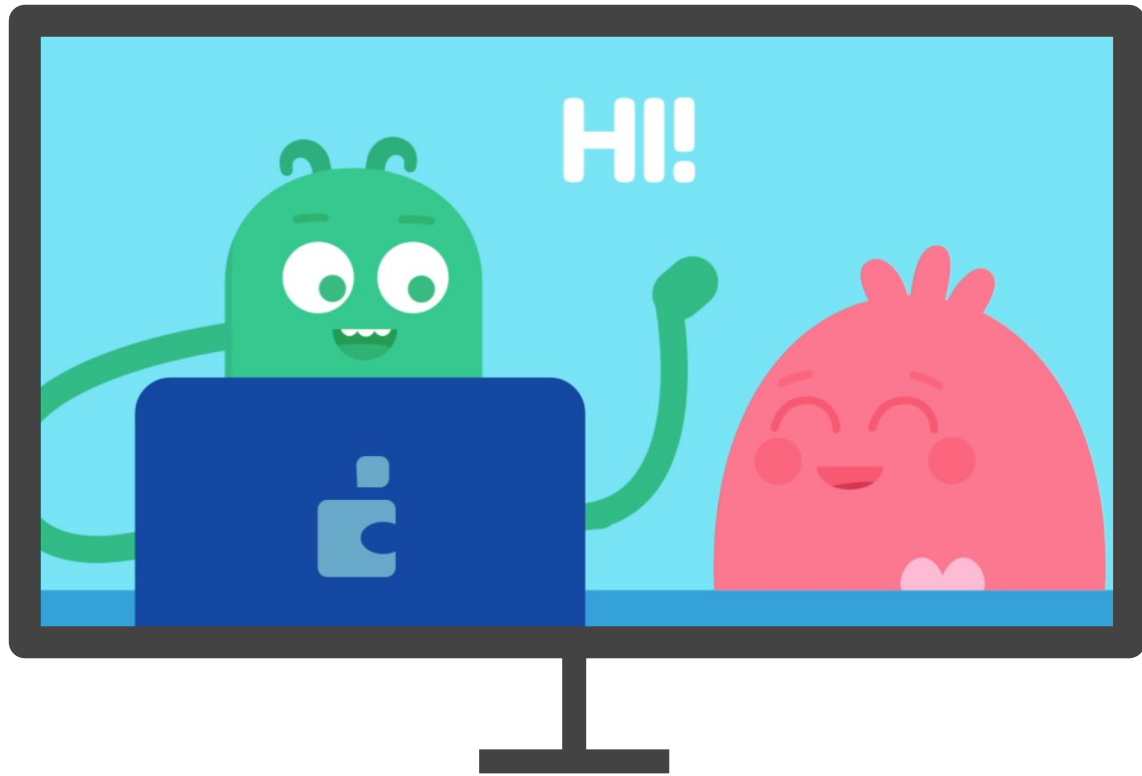

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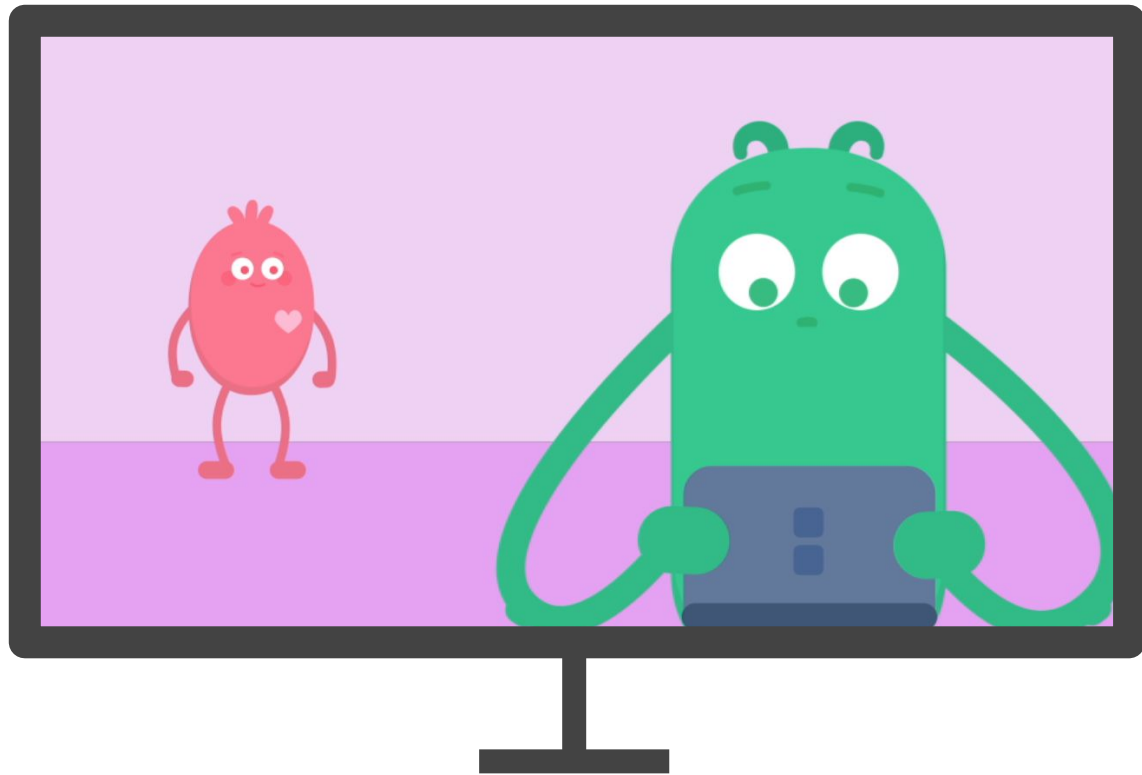


Why should

says "hi"?



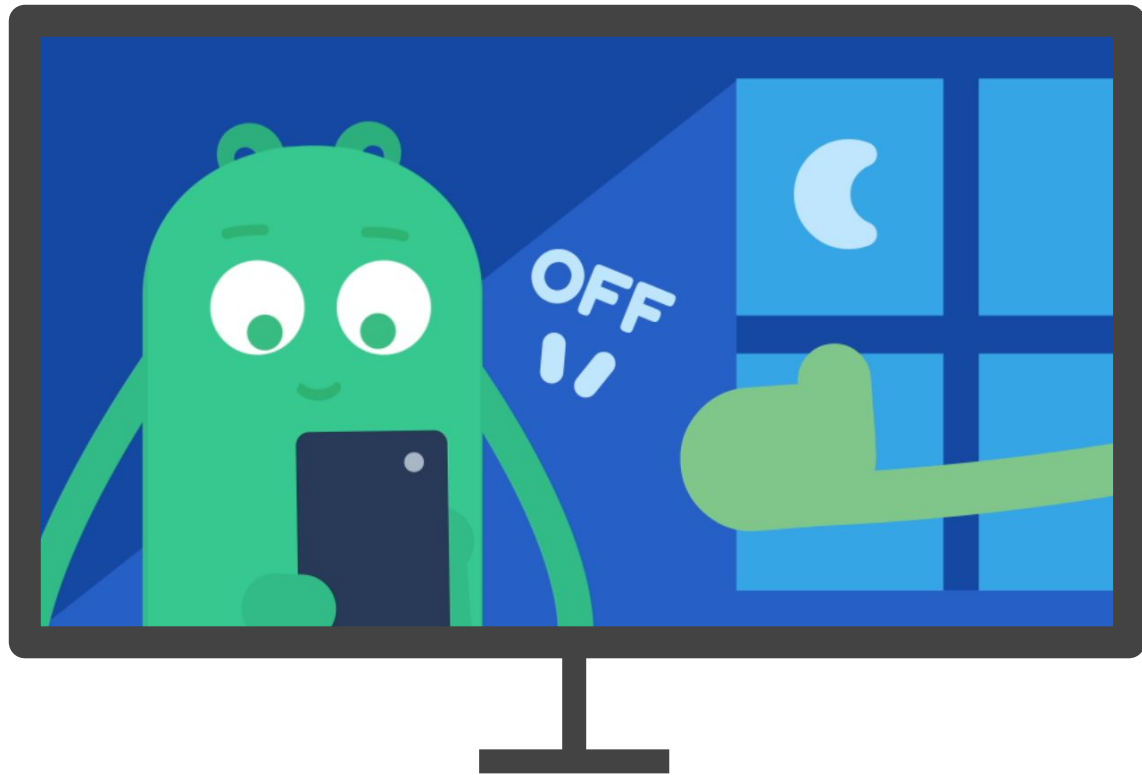


Why should

all alone?



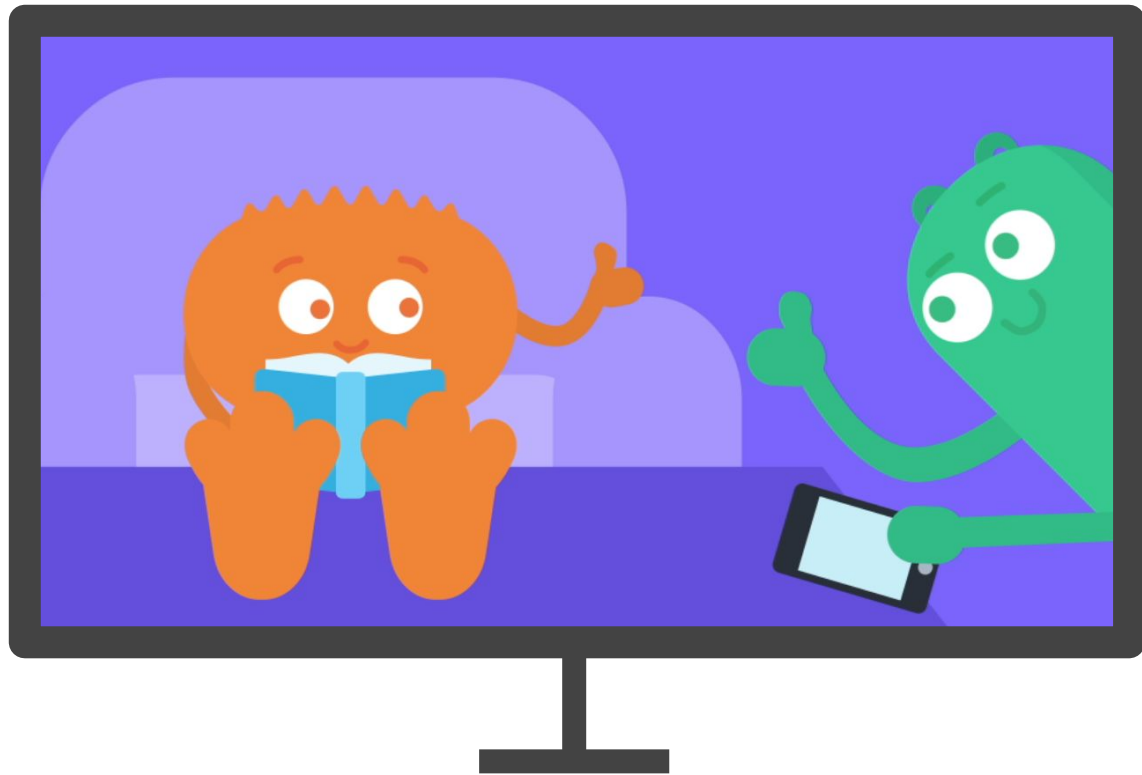


Why is it a

going to bed?

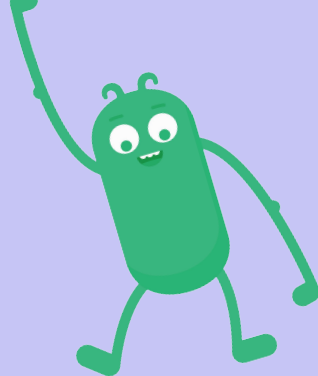




Why should

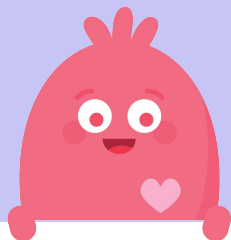



## Media Balance Is Important



### Good news:

- Listen to their feelings and tell an adult if something makes them uncomfortable.



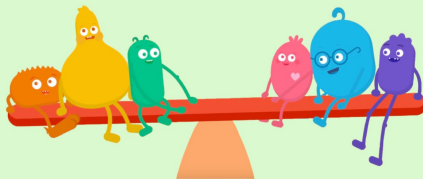
