- 3. <u>Dress Code</u> Beginning in 4th quarter on April 8th, students who do not comply with our dress code will receive detention. Students have been reminded of our expectations for student dress at school for three quarters and there is no secret with what our dress code requires on a daily basis. Please use the list below to talk with your Bronco over Spring Break about what is not appropriate for school.
- o Clothing (tops and/or bottoms) exposing the stomach or bottom, being excessively tight, see-through, low-cut or showing undergarments should not be worn.
- o Clothing or jewelry with abusive, suggestive or profane language, symbols of illegal drugs / weapons, or any other words, symbols or slogans that disrupt the learning environment.
- Bedroom shoes, flip flops, sandals, Crocs, Uggs, etc.
 *Please note that all shoes must have a fully closed toe and a fully closed heel.
- o Pants worn below the waist
- o Clothing that exposes undergarments or see through
- o Long shirts or sweatshirts that cover shorts (lamp shading)
- o Sleeveless shirts or tank tops
- o Front zippered sweatshirts and jackets without an appropriate shirt beneath
- o Headgear (scarves, bandanas, stocking caps, hats, sunglasses, doo-rags, combs, and costume wigs).
- o Student dress or grooming that is substantially and materially disruptive to the learning environment or to student health or safety is prohibited.

Please note that any type of dress or grooming deemed inappropriate or disruptive *will not be permitted at the discretion of school administration*.




Yay!Day is about more than just spreading positivity.

What is MORES?

- MORES is a team-based crisis response service that will respond w/in
 Hour of the member/guardian call asking for help for their child.
- MORES is available for Telephonic Response 24/7
- MORES is available for In Person Response: Monday-Friday 6:00 am-9:00 am, Monday-Friday 2:00 pm-10:00 pm and Saturday from 1:00-7:00 pm
- The parent/guardian may be requesting help for a child who is experiencing an emotional or behavioral crisis.
- MORES is a service that is intended to prevent placement into more restrictive settings, unnecessary court involvement, and declines in functioning.
- MORES can also be referred by a stakeholder such as DSS, DJJ, hospital, law enforcement, school personnel, etc to help support a child and family experiencing a crisis.
- MORES is able to support children and their families all along the crisis continuum, including early crisis response as well as supporting discharge and transition from the ED/hospital setting
- · The duration of a MORES episode of care can be up to eight weeks.
- The immediate face-to-face response is designed to better address the needs children and families in their homes, schools, and communities.
- MORES Interventions and Support can include:
 - Crisis response, intervention and deescalation
 - Counseling
 - · Behavioral assistance
 - Stabilization
 - Advocacy

- Skill building
- · Medication management
- Caregiver and youth engagement/ support/stabilization services
- · Referral and linkage to services/supports


