1. **FBLA State Competition** - HUGE CONGRATS to the FBLA students listed in the section below for placing in the State Competition. 1st and 2nd place finishers qualify for Nationals in June. Thanks to Dr. Lester for leading this group.

2. **Dress Code Reminder** – Earlier this week we began issuing detention for students who are out of compliance with our dress code. Students have had all year to receive warnings and to understand what is appropriate for school and what is not. Please assist us with monitoring what your Bronco wears to school and use their agenda as a reference for what is included in the dress code at Bailey.

3. **Shark Tank** - The Exploring Business Opportunities' students (Gr. 8) at Bailey are working hard to build business plans for their new business ideas in advance of the **May 21 & 22, 2024 Shark Tank** events at the school. You may be familiar with the popular TV show called Shark Tank where entrepreneurs pitch their ideas to potential investors; that is the format we will be using.
