News By Content Area:

ELA: (Angelou, Lilley, McNeirney & Trice)

In ELA class, we begin Unit 2 in October. Students will continue to read excerpts from The Lightning Thief. We will also be reading Greek myths connected to the novel comparing themes and topics in the Greek myths and The Lightning Thief. In the second half of the unit, students write an essay using the Painted Essay structure comparing and contrasting parts of Percy Jackson and the Olympians: The Lightning Thief movie with reading about the same events in the novel.

Math: (Campbell and Solorzano)

6th Grade Math students are finishing up Unit 1 the first week of October. Our Unit 1 Assessment will be on Friday, October 6. Unit 2 will focus on Ratios. This unit will include writing ratios, understanding and finding unit rates/unit price, as well as calculations with percentages. This will be a rather long unit as this is a major focus of the 6th grade math standards. We have finished all Fall Math MAP testing. We will use this data to identify areas to provide additional support to our students. Students will continue to receive math homework on Monday of each week, and it is due on Friday of each week.



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Honors Math (Day and Keady):

Students will have their End of Unit 1 Assessment this Friday, October 6th. A reteach and retest opportunity will follow. Per CMS policy, the highest retest score that can be given is 80%. Unit 2 will begin next Monday, October 9th on Area, Surface Area and Scale Drawings. Daily work is completed in workbooks that will stay in the classroom. Students will have homework weekly that they receive at the beginning of the week and will be due on Fridays. Mid and end unit

Social Studies: (Isgrigg)


October is here, and with it, we're diving deeper into the world of Social Studies in 6th Grade. We are wrapping up our first Unit and are gearing up for our first Unit Test. We will then begin Unit 2, where your students will be exploring and applying their knowledge of history, geography, economy, government, and culture to understand the fascinating development of the river valley civilizations of Mesopotamia and Egypt. Encourage your child to stay on top of their assignments and engage with their vocabulary words; this not only strengthens their understanding but also enhances their reading skills. We urge you and your students to keep a close eye on PowerSchool for grades and missing assignments. Students who consistently submit their work tend to excel in social studies.

Additionally, we empower our students to be proactive learners. If they have any questions, remind them to confidently advocate for themselves and seek help when needed. Together, we can make this academic year a resounding success!

Science: (Saliba and Taylor)

In science we are wrapping up our first unit: matter. Students completed a lab in which they measured the mass, volume and density of different everyday objects. We will start are thermal energy unit during the 2nd week of October. The thermal energy unit has a few labs we will do as well to explain how heat travels from one thing to another.







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REMINDERS:

- Online incentive trackers promote and recognize positive behaviors throughout Kennedy
 Middle School. We have a shared and consistent plan for ALL students. It gives students a
 chance to change behaviors that earn demerits. Students may receive demerits on the
 incentive tracker for a variety of reasons (Tardy, Disrespect, Disengaged and Forbidden
 Items). Students will also have the opportunity to fix mistakes with a Redemption Card.
 Redemption Cards can be given by homeroom teachers which will track a student's behavior
 for a day to remove a demerit. A low number of demerits will earn students the entry to
 an incentive reward at the end of the four-week period.
 - This week will be the first incentive reward celebration for students that earned it!
- Students are issued a monthly bathroom pass for emergency restroom use. Students must keep track of this bathroom pass. (These passes are in addition to students having the ability daily to use the bathroom during homeroom, lunch, and elective periods.) New passes came out Monday, October 2nd.
