News By Content Area:

ELA: (Angelou, Lilley, McNeirney & Trice)

We have already begun Module 1 Unit 3! In this unit, students will reimagine a scene from The Lightning Thief, which includes a new demi-god character. Students will also research a Greek god or other traditional figure and use their research to create a new character, the child of that figure. At the end of the module, students create a presentation with their research and the rewritten narrative scene for the Performance Task.



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Math: (Campbell and Solorzano)

As we begin November, we will also begin our 3rd unit in math. This unit is titled "Unit Ratios and Percentages". This unit will give our students opportunities to calculate percentages in everyday life. Students will continue to receive a homework sheet on Monday of each week, and this is due on Friday. We have been using calculators in class

and students may use calculators at home as well. As always, feel free to reach out with any questions or concerns you may have at any time.

Honors Math (Day and Keady):

Students will have their Mid Unit 2 Assessment on Thursday, November 9th. A reteach and retest opportunity will follow. Per CMS policy, the highest retest score that can be given is 80%. Unit 2 on Area, Surface Area and Scale Drawings continues through the month of November. The End of Unit 2 Assessment will be Tuesday, November 21st with Unit 3 beginning after Thanksgiving break. Daily work is completed in workbooks that will stay in the classroom. Students will have homework weekly that they receive at the beginning of the week and will be due on Fridays. Mid and end unit assessment dates are communicated to students in a timely manner. Please feel free to reach out with questions or concerns. Social Studies: (Isgrigg)

Congratulations to all students and parents on completing the first quarter of 6th grade! As we embark on the second quarter, we're wrapping up Unit 2 in Social Studies and gearing up for an exciting exploration of Unit 3, focusing on ancient civilizations in India and China. Throughout this unit, students will delve into history, geography, economy, government, and culture, applying their knowledge to understand the development of these remarkable civilizations. Science: (Saliba and Taylor)

In science we are wrapping up our first unit: matter. Students completed a lab in which they measured the mass, volume and density of different everyday objects. We will start our thermal energy unit during the 2nd week of October. The thermal energy unit has a few labs we will do as well to explain how heat travels from one thing to another. For much of October, students learned about the different types of heat transfer. We modeled convection currents using red and blue food coloring to represent hot and cold water. We also observed how heat travels from a warm to a cool substance in our conduction lab (see pics below). The heat travels through the metal bar because it is a conductor. The next unit will be on light and sound waves. This is our last physical science unit. In the waves unit students will have the opportunity to work through a sound stations lab, dissect a sheep eye, and see some light demonstrations. The waves unit is expected to carry us up to winter break.



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REMINDERS:

- Online incentive trackers promote and recognize positive behaviors throughout Kennedy Middle School. We have a shared and consistent plan for ALL students. It gives students a chance to change behaviors that earn demerits. Students may receive demerits on the incentive tracker for a variety of reasons (Tardy, Disrespect, Disengaged and Forbidden Items). Students will also have the opportunity to fix mistakes with a Redemption Card. Redemption Cards can be given by homeroom teachers which will track a student's behavior for a day to remove a demerit. A low number of demerits will earn students the entry to an incentive reward at the end of the four-week period.
- Students are issued a monthly bathroom pass for emergency restroom use. Students must keep track of this bathroom pass. (These passes are in addition to students having the ability daily to use the bathroom during homeroom, lunch, and elective periods.) New passes came out Monday, October 30th.
