Why are we here?

The Elementary and Secondary Education Act (ESEA), as amended by the Every Student Succeeds Act (ESSA) of 2015, requires that each Title I School hold an Annual Meeting for parents/families/community members for the purpose of:

What is a Title I School?

Title 1 is the largest federally funded educational program. A Title 1 school is a school receiving federal funds for students.

The basic principle of Title 1 is that schools with large concentrations of low-income students receive supplemental funds to meet students' educational goals.

What does it mean to be a Title I School?

- Being a Title I school means receiving federal funding (Title I dollars) to <u>supplement</u> the school's existing programs. These dollars are used for the following:
 - Identifying students experiencing academic difficulties and providing timely assistance to help students meet the state's challenging content standards.
 - Purchasing supplemental staff/programs/materials/supplies
 - Conducting parent and family engagement meetings/trainings/activities
 - Recruiting/Hiring/Retaining Highly-Qualified Teachers
- Being a Title I school also means encouraging ongoing parent and family engagement and advocating for parents' rights

How are Title I funds used in our school?

Title 1 Budget for 23-24 School Year: \$153,552.54 - PRC 050 - Title 1 Regular Funding

- Parent Involvement Curriculum Events
- Staffing Teacher Leaders (3 Expanded Impact teachers, 1 Multi-classroom leader)
- Professional Development Half day planning per quarter,
 Professional conferences
- Supplies and materials IXL, Educator's Handbook

Parent and Family Engagement Allocation

Parent and Family Allocation for 2023-2024: \$2,685.46

Parent and Family Engagement funds will be utilized to continue to use with improving engagement and communication through parent/family engagement events

- Activities and events planned for parents: Arts Showcase Night,
 Curriculum Night and various PTA Family Events
- During Curriculum Night, materials will be shared with parents about upcoming units of instruction and how it aligns with the state standards.

What is the School Improvement Plan/NCStar Plan?

- The School Improvement Plan (SIP) is created in an online platform called NCStar and includes:
 - A Comprehensive Needs Assessment
 - Goals and Strategies to Address Academic Needs of Students
 - Professional Development Needs
 - Coordination of Resources and Comprehensive Budget
 - The School's Parent and Family Engagement Goals
- Parents of students at Title I schools have the right to be engaged in the development of this plan
